LOCAL cancer survivor Jay Chipman has touched hearts with her small charity, and Belles Burger and Pizzeria owner Matt Hidding's personal connection with her cause has led to a delicious fundraiser.

Homely Retreats has gone from strength to strength since Ms Chipman founded the charity in 2018 to provide weekend retreats for Tasmanian cancer-affected families.

A regular at Mr Hidding's Bellerive burger joint, even hiring him to cater at her wedding, Ms Chipman said she and Mr Hidding raised about \$650 during their "2019 burger month".

They hope to raise \$1000 this month, with \$2 from every burger or margarita pizza sold donated to Homely Retreats. Mr Hidding said Ms Chipman's charity highlighted an overlooked cause.

"My mum went through cancer a while ago and I was left to look after my little brother; the idea of Homely Retreats was great," he said.

Mr Hidding hoped locals would "get a good burger and support a good

Ms Chipman said both local businesses had expanded since the first burger month.

After a family affected by cancer saw a Mercury article about Homely Retreats published in August last year, they bought a property at Taranna on the Tasman Peninsula for the charity to use for weekend getaways.
